
# St. Bernard de Clairvaux Church


**Marriages:** Couples must contact the parish office at least one year in advance. No date may be set before meeting with the priest. A marriage course is a pre-requisite.

Today is Halloween Trick or Treat!

Obviously, today is not a religious holiday and almost all of the practices associated with it come from folklore. All but one: its name. In older English before November 1<sup>st</sup> was called the feast of "All Hallows" or all the holy ones. So the night before was All Hallow's Eve and in time it became Halloween.

While, Halloween is clearly not a religious feast day, the day after certainly is. As the leaves fall and the earth prepares for its winter sleep, it was only natural that we also began to think of our own mortality. First we recall that we are not meant for death but eternal life and that death has no power over our blessed Saviour. In all ages those who have known Him and fully kept His commands have been assured a place in our heavenly homeland. They remain close to our heavenly Father and our elder brothers and sisters in the faith. They continue to care and be concerned for us and intercede for us, keeping our intention in front of God. These are the Saints. Besides they're care for us, they are examples of us to emulate, so that we too may be with them. We honour them on the feast of All Saints: and this day also reminds and encourages us to be open our hearts fully to the Lord, to be in all ways His disciples so that we too may be Holy, that we too may know the fullness of Christ's joy and peace, which we can experience in this world and then fully in the next.

The next day is the Commemoration of All Souls where we pray for those who have died. We especially that day remember those souls in purgatory. Purgatory was once seen as a place of punishment, but St. Catherine of Genoa reminds us that it is part of the mercy of God. Purgatory is a place where those in need of it, those who have indeed accepted Christ but perhaps less than perfectly, have a place wherein they are purified so that they may then go straight away into Heaven. The Lord is indeed just, but He is also loving and does not reject those who wish to be with Him. These dear souls need our help by our prayers and offerings and so we especially on the Commemoration of All Souls have the opportunity to do a good and charitable act for them so that we may all one day be together in the Glory of God which surpasses all joy and understanding.
