

IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING COVID 19 PROTOCALS FOR THE HOLIDAYS

Due to the potential risk of the Omicron Variant of Covid 19 and the fact that we may have new parishioners joining us for the Solemn celebrations for Christmas and the Solemnity Mother of God on January 1st, we need to introduce a slightly different Covid Protocal for the holidays.

A reminder capacity limit in the Church is 125 people.

These new protocals will be strictly enforced:

- 1. We will be entering and exiting from the main doors, a reminder masks must be worn.
- 2. As soon as you come in, we are asking for your contact information, name and telephone number.
- 3. As you enter the Church your hands will be sanitized.
- 4. In order to celebrate with us, you must ensure that your mask is properly worn at all times, covering your nose and mouth.
- 5. It is important that we continue to practice social distancing.
- 6. We ask you to continue the normal safety protocals when in the Church: namely; that we come up for Communion one row at a time and that if you are feeling ill, especially if you are coughing, that you refrain from celebrating in person.

We encourage everyone to arrive earlier than normal, so that we may avoid longer wait times and lines as you try to enter.
