As I was driving one day, I turned on the radio to a talk station. I heard someone say that being nice and good is the essential part of Christianity. I turned off the radio, the people on it were pundits not experts to be trusted. Of course charity is vitally important. None of us can say we are following Christ without being concerned about other people. It's the second great commandment the Lord taught us. That's right it's the second. The first came just before this in the Gospel of St. Matthew chapter 22 versus 34-40. "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment" That the first commandment is that Christianity is ultimately about you know ... Christ: Believing in Him, worshipping Him and trusting Him. And you can't have a relationship with Christ without praying or talking to Him.

There are formal prayers, those that are written down and we can learn. The greatest is worship which we do at Mass, but there are devotions like the Rosary and many other standalone prayers. Formal prayers are important because they present to us the truths of our faith and form us. But there is also informal prayer, or talking to God in your own way. That's important too, there is an intimacy in them. In both we may hear God's voice.

Now like most people I can't say I've heard an actual voice when I pray. It's mostly a turn of phrase. Usually, we mean that God gives us a thought. A person once asked me a very good question. "Father, how do I know it's God and my mind is not just making it up" Well three things have to be present: First it does not contradict the teaching of the Church. God isn't going to tell us one thing openly and the opposite to you privately. That would make Him a liar. And God is certainly not a liar. Second, we need to know ourselves: I know how I think and I know that there are some thoughts that I wouldn't have in a million years. Lastly, even if He asks us something that is hard for us it brings us peace. When we have this thought and we respond to it, we may right away or the next time we pray sense a thought in response and as we respond again, we begin to have what is typically called a conversation with God.

The thing I've learned about conversations with God is that it takes time. And with our busy schedules it's hard to do. But we only have time for what we make time for. We need to set time aside each day even for 10 min at least for Him, beginning and end of day.

But in the slower times of vacation while it's good to relax and recharge we can also renew our time with God. It refocuses us and gives us new impetus for the busy time

to come. I've learned that about vacations. They are a slowdown not a shut down. And just like we don't want to take a vacation from our family we ought not take a vacation from Mass or God: after all the first aspect of Christianity is Christ.


