# CONFIRMATION 2024

There will be a pre-registration meeting for those wishing to rceive the Sacrament of Confirmation on Tuesday, October 10<sup>th</sup>, at 7:00 pm at the Church. Please bring the following with you:

1) The completed registration form with a copy of your child's baptismal certificate.

2) A fee that covers the cost of materials to be used at the Catechesis classes. Information will be given to you at the registration meeting.

For those who do not attend St. Bernard's School (which would have been given a form from the school by mid-September) but belong to our parish we are most happy to celebrate the sacrament with you.

If your child is 12 or over and not baptized, but would like to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion and Confirmation you must attend this meeting. Similiarly for those who are not baptized Catholic but would like to enter the Catholic Church and receive the Sacraments, please speak to Fr. Boniface about Baptism and First Holy Communion. If you need a pre-registration form(s) for one or any of these sacraments, please come to the office or if you have any questions, speak to Father Boniface after the Sunday Mass.

### "For I Was Hungry and You Gave Me Food" – Catholic Community Pledges \$500,000 to Fight Crisis

TORONTO (September 6, 2023) – As an increasing number of people struggle to put food on the table, the Catholic community is drawing upon its legacy of service to tackle this contemporary crisis.

ShareLife, the annual charitable appeal of the Archdiocese of Toronto, is committing over a half million dollars to the fight against hunger through Food Security Grants. The funding consists of three pillars

• \$250,000 in new funding to the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul Toronto Central Council, which will distribute grants to parish-based food banks and meal programs

• \$150,000 in new funding to Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Toronto, which will distribute grants to agency-run food programs

• \$120,000 already allocated to Catholic Charities for food-related programs through its member agencies.

Funding for some of these programs began in November 2022.

"It is heart-wrenching and unacceptable that anyone in our city today lacks access to food which is a most basic human right," says Archbishop Francis Leo. Our parishioners are taking action in response to the Lord's call to feed the hungry. Since the earliest days of the Catholic community in the Archdiocese of Toronto, the faithful have cared for those in need, on the margins of society and we continue this life-giving legacy."

"We see our neighbours in need increasingly struggle with food insecurity," adds Louise Coutu, Executive Director of the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul Toronto Central Council. "As part of our mission of 'turning concern into action,' we are ready to assist with the expansion of parish-based food and meal programs through this bold initiative."

"Those in hunger cannot wait for the systemic causes of food insecurity to be solved before we take action," says Dr. Agnes Thomas, Executive Director of Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Toronto. "By working with member agencies and other partners already on the ground, we are **making an immediate impact in the lives of the most vulnerable." 
