MASS MINUTES - WEEK 14 LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYERS;

The First Eucharistic Prayer, also known as the Roman Canon was the only one in use in the Roman Rite before the Second Vatican Council. This Eucharistic Prayer comes down to us almost exactly the same as it was when St. Ambrose of Milan prayed it in the fourth century and referred to it as already of long use in the Church in Rome: (Ambrose De Sacramentis) A distinctive characteristic of the Roman Canon is the litany of Roman martyrs and other martyrs venerated in Rome from the early persecutions of the Church. This gives the prayer its name; Canon is Greek for a list, namely the "list" of martyrs invoked at Rome.

The Church in Rome prayed to the saints who died for her in the Eucharistic Prayer very fittingly because the martyrs participate in the Heavenly Liturgy that the Church on earth participates in through the Holy Mass. The use of the same Eucharistic Prayer as that used by the Church in Rome expresses very strongly unity with and fidelity to the Pope.

The Second Eucharist Prayer also has ancient but less certain origins. The text of the prayer itself is derived from the third century work *The Apostolic Tradition*, attributed to St. Hipolytus of Rome. It was not a commonly used Eucharistic Prayer in the Church in the West before the Second Vatican Council.

The Third Eucharistic Prayer is not ancient at all but has in fact been composed since the Second Vatican Council in the 1960's. It is modeled on the Roman Canon while taking elements from other Eucharistic Prayers including those of other Rites within the Church.

The Fourth Eucharistic Prayer is modeled on that of St. Basil who lived in the 6th Century. It is very noticeably different in parts from the other Eucharistic Prayers particularly by its extended narration of salvation history. Other Eucharistic Prayers used only when warranted are also currently included in the Roman Missal. There are two Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation mostly used in Advent and Lent, there are two for uses with children and more recently for others written in Switzerland, obviously called the Swiss Canons, have also been approved for use at Masses when we intercede with God for specific reasons, such as, praying in times of trial or in thanksgiving for God's goodness and mercy to us.
