MASS MINUTES - WEEK 21 THE COMMUNION RITE – "THE FRACTION"

The Fraction is the breaking of the host (the Body of Christ) during the Lamb of God and "signifies that the many faithfuls are made one body (1 Cor 10:17) by receiving Communion from the one Bread of Life which is Christ, who died and rose for the salvation of the world" (GIRM, 83). A piece of the broken Body of Christ is placed into the chalice with the Blood of Christ. Originally in the Papal Masses at Rome the Pope would break off small pieces of the main host and a deacon would carry Him to all the priests who would celebrate Mass that day and they would put the host in the chalice as a way of showing that their Mass would be done in union with the Pope. This practice eventually signified the unity of the Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation" (Ibid.). While the body and blood are for us separate in the passion, they are one, Christ's body was given for us, His blood washed away are sins.

The Fractioning takes place while the faithful sing or recite the Lamb of God highlighting the fact that forgiveness of sins came about through Christ's offering of Himself on the Cross. In the Old Testament, the lamb was a sacrificial animal that the High Priest would offer in remission of the sins of the people. Christ is the Lamb of God because He is offered for the remission of sins and for all times. Christ is also the High Priest because He is the one who offers the sacrifice. "No one takes my life from Me), he tells Pilot in the Gospel of John "I have power to lay down my life and power to take it up again."

The Fraction and Lamb of God remind the faithful of who they are about to receive and the following prayer reminds the faithful of the humility with which they should approach the altar. The priest faces the people and holds up the Body of Christ and says: "This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Happy are those who are called to His supper." The faithful reply "Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed." The words of the priest recall the aspect of the Masses participation in the heavenly banquet, that is eternal life in union with God who is the source and cause of all goodness and happiness. The faithful are truly very blessed to be invited to this banquet and should approach it with great thankfulness and praise to Him whose banquet it is. The response of the faithful, "Lord I am not worthy," recalls the words of the centurion to Christ in the Gospel (Matt 8:8). Though the faithful know that they are infinitely unworthy to receive the gift that God offers, they also have faith that Christ has the power to heal them and make them worthy. So, the members of the Church approach the Christ and receive Him with humility knowing their unworthiness and with the Church approach the Christ and receive Him with humility knowing their unworthiness and with confidence acknowledging God's power to make worthy those whom he has called to receive Him.
